

A MULTI-STOREY MIXED WORKSPACE AND INDUSTRIAL SCHEME DESIGNED FOR AN URBAN COMMUNITY

Regenerative design and circular economy principles are at the centre of this multi-storey mixed workspace and industrial concept.

The scheme will add social, environmental and economic value to surrounding communities while boosting biodiversity, with reference to 15 Minute City methodology, championing the Circular Economy and implementing the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

KEY FEATURES OF THE PROJECT INCLUDE

- SME sustainable manufacturing space, external roof areas, open to the wider community, offer play and food growing space
- Space for green start-ups, micro enterprises and supporting retail to create a 'social high street'
- Multi-functional town hall facility that can be used by the local community. This offers a civic presence and a permanent place to collaborate, debate and socialise as well as temporary spaces for exhibitions and pop-up events
- An on-site material store facility, as part of a Construction Skills School, enabling occupiers to consider material reuse in the fitout of their spaces
